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Syllabus Of UPPSC GIC Lecturer exam

UPPSC GIC Lecturer Exam Structure

The UPPSC GIC Lecturer exam is divided into two main stages: the **Preliminary Exam** and the **Main Exam**.



I. Preliminary Exam

The preliminary exam consists of one objective and multiple-choice question paper.

- Type of Paper: Objective and Multiple Choice Type
- Total Questions: 120 questions
 - Optional Subject: 80 questionsGeneral Studies: 40 questions
- Total Marks: 300 marksTime Duration: 2 hours
- Syllabus:
 - General Studies:
 - 1. General Science (High School Standard)
 - 2. History of India
 - 3. Indian National Movement
 - 4. Indian Polity, Economy & Culture
 - 5. Indian Agriculture, Commerce & Trade
 - 6. World Geography & Indian Geography & Natural resources of India
 - 7. Current National and International Important events
 - 8. Logic & Reasoning based on General Intelligence
 - 9. Specific knowledge regarding Education, Culture, Agriculture, Industry Trade, Living & Social Traditions of Uttar Pradesh

- 10. **Elementary Mathematics** up to 8th level (Arithmetic, Algebra, and Geometry)
- 11. Ecology and Environment
- Optional Subjects: The syllabus for optional subjects in the preliminary exam is the same as that of the main exam.

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II. Main Exam

The main exam includes two traditional question papers.

1. First Question Paper: General Hindi and Essay

This paper is **Traditional** in nature.

Time Duration: 2 hoursTotal Marks: 100 marks

- Parts:
 - First Part: General Hindi (Total 50 marks)
 - Content:
 - 1. Summarization of unread passages, questions related to it, explanation of underlined parts, and determining its appropriate title
 - 2. Antonyms, synonyms, similar and identical words, regional foreign words (word stock).
 - 3. Spelling, meaning, word forms, conjunction, compound, verbs, Hindi alphabet, punctuation marks.
 - 4. Word formation, sentence structure, meaning, idioms and proverbs.
 - 5. Main dialects of Uttar Pradesh and errors in the use of Hindi language.
 - Second Part: Hindi Essay (Total 50 marks)
 - Format: There will be one section, and one essay will have to be written from this section.
 - Length Limit: The maximum length limit of this essay will be 1000 words.
 - Areas for the Essay:
 - 1. Literature, Culture
 - 2. National Development Plans / Implementation
 - 3. National, International, Contemporary Social Problems / Solutions
 - 4. Science and Environment

- 5. Natural Disasters and their Prevention
- 6. Agriculture, Industry and Trade

2. Second Question Paper: Optional Subjects

This paper is also **Traditional** in nature.

Time Duration: 3 hoursTotal Marks: 300 marks
